



WE DO IT ALL

- * In fact we do tons of things. Front-end, back-end, UX, config, devops, project management, user support.
- × We are generalists. A little bit of everything.
- * But we don't want to do all the things, ie: digging in code, sysops.




WE ARE LIKE DEVELOPERS, BUT WITH TINY BUDGETS

- × We don't want to be on the bleeding edge. Migrations and learning new frameworks are expensive.
- * We make efficient use of modules instead of writing custom code.
- × We need turnkey hosting.

WE'RE NOT ALONE

The vast majority of Drupal sites (> 63%) are running D7.x. Less than 30% are D8.x.

WE DON'T NEED BIG DEV POWER TOOLS

- * If we only manage a couple of sites, we don't need tools that automate tasks we rarely do
- × We don't always have access to our servers.
- * It's often not worth the investment of time & effort to set up local dev environments, Docker/Drush/Lando/Composer, etc.



WE ACTUALLY USE DOCUMENTATION


- × We don't always have experts we can ask.
- We rely on contrib and core module documentation.
- * Make requirements clear so that we can choose the right modules and themes without trial & error.



WE MADE DRUPAL GREAT

- × 2000: Dries creates forum software
- × 2004: Howard Dean builds online community
- × 2005~2010: Nonprofits and grassroots groups discover Drupal can build community sites without tons of programming, & they spread the word
